- ► Ensure your work is properly marked. A notice can deter infringement, as it states that the work is protected under law.
- Optional Registering/Deposit of a work.
- ► Keep supporting evidence.
- Agreement between co-authors.

Arguments FOR

- Establishment of a central depository.
- ▶ To trace ownership of works.
- ▶ To facilitate contact with owners.
- Can provide evidence of ownership.

SHOULD THERE BE A VOLUNTARY COPYRIGHT REGISTRATION/DEPOSIT SYSTEM AS EXISTS IN SOME JURISDICTIONS?

Arguments AGAINST

- Creating false impressions.
- Cost burden.
- Lack of a comprehensive registry.
- Possibility of abuse of the system.
- Would not give any form of protection.
- Would not conclusively establish ownership.

WHAT IS THE STATE OF COPYRIGHT IN THE CARIBBEAN REGION?

- ▶ Lack of modern Intellectual Property Laws.
- No Regional Policy on Intellectual Property.
